July 7-10, 2023 eight volunteers spent evenings checking all six wards in McAlester for non working street lights. PSO changed the street lights to LED in early 2023. We were able to report on 20 non working lights that were immediately fixed.

FALL CLEAN UP









Fall cleanup was held the first two weekends of October 2023. 20 volunteers assisted 420 vehicles remove 172,754 lbs of bulk trash, 27,340 lbs of scrap metal was recycled, and 10,610 lbs of unwanted electronics, were kept out of the landfill.

KMB held a litter picking at Hunter Park on that Saturday before, 11/11/23. 15 volunteers helped up pick up the park.














December



April found us back at the recycling grounds for four weekends of cleanup. 45 volunteers assisted 1093 vehicles remove a total of 594,743 lbs of unwanted residential debris. This included 10,240 lbs of tires, 57,200 lbs of metal recycled, and 5,972 lbs of hazardous material.




Scholarship














Adopt A Park, launched in the spring










October 3, 2023 Keep McAlester
